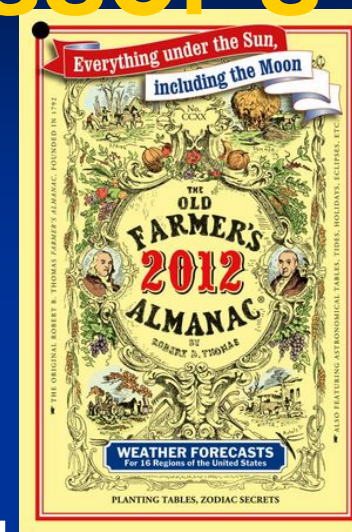

- Talk to people – department, profession
- Learn what colleagues do - tell what you do
 - Where to submit papers?
 - Interpreting editors' letters & referees' reports
- Go to conferences, participate in sessions
- Meet others with similar interests – promotion letters
- Invest in a website with current CV, working papers, and keep it up to date

Two Heads Are Better than One

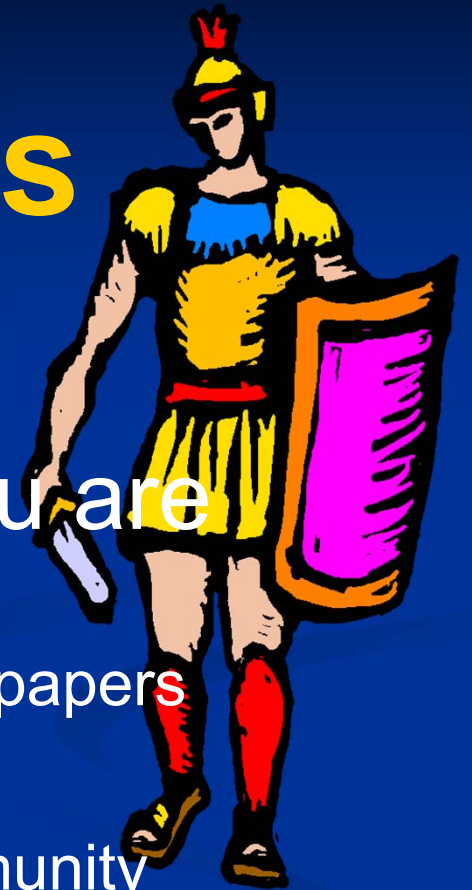


- Talk to people, bounce ideas, ask questions
- Shape your ideas – 5 minute test
- Decisions about allocating time & energy – fruitful or dead end?
- Econometric advice, related research, no wheel reinvention
- Co-author?

Know what is valued where you are

- Teaching evaluation numbers, UG student papers
- Directing grad student work
- Service & applied research with local community
- Research top peer-reviewed journals - which?



Keep Your Eye on the Prize



Tenure? Position? Location?

- Time flies! Clock ticks.
- To be accepted, papers must be submitted.
- Lags can be long – reviews, revisions, resubmits
- Beware! paralysis of perfection kills careers

Don't Put All Eggs in One Basket



Randomness → Risk → Diversify

- Number of activities
- Anchor publications – Rome & profession define
- Supporting publications for anchors
- New teaching technique in all courses
- All or nothing risks flop
